This forum is aimed at social workers currently working in the field, to share their knowledge and experience; and those in universities involved in social work education; social workers and students from across other fields, wanting to gain and contribute their understanding of the area.

About the Forum:

There is little social work presence in age care, especially in residential settings. The main areas of employment of social workers have been in hospitals, mental health, community health in allied health teams, community care settings such as case management and in private practice. In the current climate of individual funding and consumer directed care both within NDIS & in Age Care (both in community & residential settings) how can social work be significantly involved? How can the AASW support a presence and how can universities foster the development of knowledge and skills in this area and prepare the students for such a new and changing environment? These are some of the questions we hope to explore.

In the morning we will hear from a number of speakers sharing their experiences and raising important issues to be workshopped in the afternoon.

After lunch there will be the opportunity to discuss the important issues raised, culminating in a panel focusing on ideas for furthering social work in aged care into the future.
